The Inclusive Education Network of the European Educational Research Association (EERA) and the Faculty of Philosophy University of Belgrade, with the support of Centre for the promotion of science, Škograd research centre and Educational Research Association of Serbia are pleased to announce the call for

2023 EERA Summer School "Inclusive approaches to educational research"

12 - 14 July 2023 at the University of Belgrade, Serbia.

We warmly invite PhD students and early career researchers interested in transforming educational practices through the research to apply to our three-day summer school.

Why should you apply?

- → Opportunities to share and discuss research ideas, plans and/ or proposals in small groups and to receive feedback from international researchers who will share their expertise and experiences on a wide range of educational and social issues,
- → Keynote lectures which will provide diverse perspectives on potentials of inclusive approaches to educational research,
- → Interactive workshops and hands-on activities to develop the participants' capacities for employing inclusive approaches at different stages of a research process,
- → Field trips/site visits to places developed through community-based participatory research:
 - ◆ a local school in one of the informal neighbourhoods in Belgrade, which conducts the participatory action research in collaboration with the Schoolcity collective,
 - ◆ the <u>Center for the promotion of science</u>, a public institution that aims at developing scientific literacy and citizen science program,
- → Opportunities to exchange ideas and experiences with peers and tutors from diverse backgrounds in a dynamic and socio-historically rich context.

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How to make the research meaningful and meaningful for whom?

What is the role of values in educational research?

How to ensure authentic participation throughout research?

How to integrate 'ethics work' into research?

During the summer school we will raise some questions that shape our understanding of research, but also to build a community of PhD students and early career researchers interested in searching for answers that could help us make educational research more inclusive.

Inclusive approaches to educational research aim to legitimise the expertise and perspectives that emerge from situated knowledge and lived experience, particularly of those who have been historically marginalised, by creating spaces where diverse voices can be heard. Authentic participation in research encourages participants to critically reflect on their position, map the gap between what is and what could be, and take an active role in bridging that gap. The summer school will be an opportunity to discuss the potential of educational research to enable participants who frequently experience marginalisation to positively impact upon their own lives and their communities.

Who can apply and what is needed?

If you are a PhD student or an early career researcher you can apply for this summer school. The summer school is open to participants from both member and non-member countries of EERA. Your field of work must relate to educational research.

The submission form will include:

- Abstract of your research or research idea, no more than 1.800 characters long (including short description of the conceptual framework, aims and research questions, intended methodology)
- Main references (up to 800 characters)
- CV
- Motivation for participation in the summer school

The Summer School will be held in English.

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Cost

- 180 € for participants currently living in a High GDP country
- 120 € for participants currently living in a Low GDP country
- 80 € (local participants or participants with self-organized accommodation)

Cost includes tuition, field trips, meal and accommodation expenses. The participants will share a double room with another participant. A single room can be requested at an additional cost of 25 € per night.

Please note that the crucial factor for the reduced Low GDP fee is not the country of origin but the country of residence.

You can find the list of low GDP countries here. As grounds for determining the GDP status of a country, EERA used the World bank data, GDP per capita. The threshold for low-GDP country status is an annual per capita GDP which is lower than 71% of the GDP of the total EU.
