Mykonos: One of the most famous Cycladic Islands

Mykonos is Greece's most famous cosmopolitan island, a whitewashed paradise in the heart of the Cyclades. Pay a visit to the church of Panayia Paraportiani, the Town hall and the castle situated above the harbour. Don't foret to visit the Archeological, Folklore and Maritime Museums to take in a little history. One of the most scenic corners of the island is "Little Venice", an 18th century district, dominated by grand captains' mansions with colorful balconies and stylish windows.
